PROGRAMS UPDATE

Native Tree Nursery

Our nursery program continues to grow. We have now sold another 1,000 native trees to a property developer at Sandy Beach. Envite recently purchased 400 coastal wattles for their Green Army to plant out. The greenhouse is now up at the Corindi farm and the shed is due for construction on the 4th of September.

We have had lots of interest from various Bush Regeneration groups for the purchase of our trees.



In addition, we currently have 2,000 immature Blueberry plants that we have grown from cuttings and we are now starting to plant cuttings for another 3,000 blueberry plants for growers around Coffs Harbour and Woolgoolga.

Darrunda-Wajaarr Green Team

The Green Team have been busy cleaning out the sheds at Corindi. They have also been busy in the bush having recently undertaken some traditional burning off. The Darrunda-Wajaarr team, in co-operation with the NSW Fire Brigade, did a burn off at Green Bluff (Moonee Beach Headland). Alita Carberry also undertook the burn-off at the airport (as published in the Advocate).

Our ancestors regularly used fire to burn vegetation to facilitate hunting and to change the composition of plant and animal species in an area. This practice is still used in the Northern Territory. Burn off also helps protect our fire-prone country from wild-fires.

CULTURE & HERITAGE

Our site officer's have been busy with site work at Corindi, Boambee Headland, Sandy Beach and at Karangi. There is further work coming up for site inspection at Sandy Beach, Karangi (monitoring with CHCC on the installation of the duplicate water pipeline to Red Hill), monitoring development works that are occurring at Hearnes Lake Road Woolgoolga and work to undertaken at Morgans Road Moonee Beach. The more site work that we do means more money for the Land Council.

We are also in the process of finalising an agreement with the NSW Forestry Corporation whereby our Site Officers will undertake site inspections with Forestry staff in proposed logging areas and other areas as advised by Forestry to determine the presence of sites of Aboriginal significance within our forests.



FINANCE UPDATE

Not much news from the finance sector except that all is above board and going well. We were recently audited and we are pleased to announce that

PROPERTY UPDATE

Our Quarterly House Inspections went well with the overall result being good. A few repairs to be done but other than that we are very happy. Also speaking of Inspections we will be running another lot in the next 3-4 Months.



We also have 3 Houses we are in the process of allocating. If you're on the Waiting List with us it's so important you keep us up to date with your contact details to give yourself the opportunity to be housed and for us to contact you for whatever reason as easy as possible. We suggest that you update your details with us at least annually or whenever you change your phone number or address.

We are slowing getting our tenant arrears down and all tenants are getting back on track. Just remember to keep up your payments and if you have any issues or questions, do not hesitate to contact us at the office.

PLEASE NOTE: In relation to the election for Board members;




