I also play a huge part in my community by being on Community committees such as: CHASE, Coffs Cultural Reference Group, and the Gumbaynggirr Cultural Committee for Opal Cove. What I really enjoy is working for my community and as the Property Assistant I am doing just that. I get to provide support and assistance to community members who find it difficult to find affordable housing. I also get to meet people in our community that I may not otherwise have met through my work at the Land Council. I absolutely love working at the Land Council.

ALITA CARBERRY—BUSH REGENERATOR DURRUNDA-WAJAARR GREEN TEAM

Alita has been with the CH&D LALC Durrundawajaarr Green Team since April 2014. Alita is a single mum raising a beautiful 13year old daughter Alinta and she is an inspiration to her extended family. PROGRAMS UPDATE

THE NURSERY

Darrunda Wajaar Jaliigirr Barragin (Our Native Tree nursery)

We recently received the last lot of tables for the nursery greenhouses and we are powering along with propagation. We have had the water tanks delivered and are now busy installing the irrigation to the greenhouse and hot houses. We had Ian Brown come out to do a site survey whilst the digging was taking place to ensure if any artefacts were uncovered they would be dealt with in accordance to protection under *NPW Act 1974*. Ian also provided a Cultural Heritage Induction to Tony Gleeson (Nursery Worker) so that Tony could monitor any further earth works at the nursery.

Our Cultural Heritage Team have been working very hard undertaking site monitoring on the Karangi to Red Hill water main duplication project with CHCC.

The team have also been working with Jacqui Collins (Archaeologist) at the Lorikeet Holiday Park after artefacts were located within the park where they are proposing to extend the camping sites. We have also had the Site Officers out at Corindi Quarry, the Coffs Harbour Gun Club , a proposed subdivision at McIntosh Crescent Woolgoolga, Lyons Road Sawtell, Red Rock Caravan Park, Syd Burke Park at Pine Creek and at Cox's Lane Corindi. As well as all the above work we have had a member of the public return artefacts that he had collected during the sixties from our Moonee midden site and from the Sawtell area. We are very pleased to have had them returned to their rightful place .



Some end of financial year achievements for our Green Team: Jaliigirr project is almost finished with just one zoned area to be planted out with native trees. The Local Land Service (LLS) from Victoria wants to share knowledge and skills with Darrunda-Wajaarr Green team as they were so impressed with the work we have been doing.

LLS—National Park sites will be completed by the end of June. On Monday 30th we held a Cultural Knowledge & Sharing event which was covered by NBN news. To see the coverage of the event go to


